SAMUEL GOLDWYN FILMS FINDS 'THE COUSIN' IN VENICE

Ehud Bleiberg ('THE BAND'S VISIT') produced the film with writer/director Tzahi Grad

LOS ANGELES (October 9, 2018) – Samuel Goldwyn Films has landed the U.S. rights to writer/director/actor Tzahi Grad's film "**THE COUSIN**," which had its premiere at the 74th Venice Film Festival. The film has also won a FEDEORA European Film Critics Prize, and Best Actor wins for Grad at the Imagineindia Film Festival in Spain and at the Haifa International Film Festival.

In the film, a well-intentioned Arabic-Muslim handyman (Ala Dakka, "7 Days in Entebbe") upends the day-to-day lives of the locals in a small Israeli village. Shortly after his arrival, a young woman is assaulted and the community quickly turns accusatory. His employer (Grad, "Big Bad Wolves") is the only one who believes him, but even those loyalties are tested as more information and secrets are uncovered.

Ehud Bleiberg ("The Band's Visit") produced with Grad. Charles Wachsberg ("Manhattan Undying") and Nicholas Donnermeyer ("The Iceman") are executive producers.

"THE COUSIN" will continue making the rounds on the festival circuit before its theatrical/VOD release in early 2019. Bleiberg Entertainment is handling the worldwide sales and will be shopping to international distributors during the American Film Market in November.
